The Hole Story

Jackson or Jackson Hole? This is the question that your family and friends who do not live in the area will be asking. The answer is both. Jackson Hole is a valley that encompasses the following communities: Jackson, Wilson, Teton Village, Kelly, Moose, and Moran. If you are moving to any one of these towns then, yes, you will be living in Jackson Hole. The main difference is in the postal system. FYI, getting your family and friends to mail you packages correctly may just be one of the hardest things you will ever have to do here. Feel free to contact the Chamber for suggestions.

Our Backyard

Jackson Hole encompasses Grand Teton National Park (est. 1929) and is just south of Yellowstone National Park (est. 1872). The establishment of these parks has brought many adventurous visitors to the region who spread the word. As a resident, you quickly learn that you share your home with over 3,000,000 visitors from all over the world in the summers. Winter visitation is also high, but not as extreme, as we average around 500,000 visitors.

The Grand Scheme of Things

Jackson Hole is surrounded by stunning mountain ranges including the Teton, Gros Ventre, Absaroka and Snake River Ranges. The Grand Teton is the region's highest peak at 13,766 feet above sea level. When Teddy Roosevelt first laid eyes on the Teton Range, he said they "are what mountains are supposed to look like."

Your New Neighbors

Native Americans, fur trappers, cattle ranchers, cowboys, movie stars, and tycoons have each played their parts in Jackson Hole's past. Many unique characters call Jackson Hole home and everyone has a special connection to the outdoors. The Census Bureau released an estimate of 20,002 people as of July 1, 2007 living in Teton County. That's 8,830 more people than reported in 1990. No worries, although the county is growing, it has been able to maintain a friendly, laid back-small town, western attitude. You will notice right away!

Artful Living

Enjoying outdoor activities is only part of the story when living in Teton County. With the Center for the Arts, Grand Teton Music Festival, the National Museum of Wildlife Art, the Art Association, Jackson Hole Historical Society and Museum and over thirty art galleries, Jackson is also a growing cultural center. History and Development

Before 1800, Jackson Hole was home to Native Americans who spent summer months hunting the abundant wildlife. In the early 1800s the Lewis and Clark Corps of Discovery began exploring the mountain west. John Colter, one of the members of the expedition, set out on his own to scout for a fur trading company. Tales he told about northwestern Wyoming seemed unbelievable, but many famous trappers followed Colter's lead. Jim Bridger, Jedediah Smith, William Sublette and David Jackson were some of Colter's contemporaries and their names were given to many local landmarks. It was David Jackson who gave his name to the valley. For the mountain men a "hole" indicated a high valley that was surrounded by mountains and so the valley south of Yellowstone became known as "Jackson's Hole." Later it was shortened to "Jackson Hole." French Canadian trappers named the three prominent peaks of the area in a less traditional fashion, "Les Trois Tetons." "The Three Breasts" became known as the Grand Teton, Middle Teton, and South Teton.

Jackson Hole Traditions

The Jackson Hole Chamber of Commerce holds a number of special events throughout the year that bring community members and visitors together to enjoy the unique culture of Jackson Hole.

ElkFest

A weekend of activities built around the world-famous Jackson Hole Boy Scout Elk Antler Auction. It is an exciting time for celebrating nature, outdoor skills, hunting and ecological education and awareness.

Old West Days

Jackson Hole has long been referred to as "The Last of the Old West" and each summer is greeted with a bang! The weekend includes live music, theatrical entertainment, arts and crafts, delicious food, the Old West Brewfest, the Rotary Club's annual Wine Festival, the Shootout Gang, rodeo events and much, much more.
Memorial Day Weekend

Fourth of July

The day is historically filled with family-friendly activities, including a pancake breakfast, Howdy Pardner's Fourth of July parade, Grand Teton Music Festival's "Music in the Hole," and world-class fireworks displays at the base of Snow King Mountain and in Teton Village!

Jackson Hole Fall Arts Festival

This festival is one of the premier cultural events in the Rocky Mountain West. Thousands of art enthusiasts are drawn each year to experience the diverse artwork and breathtaking natural surroundings that make Jackson Hole a leading cultural center. *2nd and third Week in September*

Jackson Hole and the greater Teton area offer visitors and residents a rich diversity of events, programs, facilities, services and products inspired by an initiative to promote health and wellness of the mind, body, spirit and earth.

Change of Seasons

Winter (Late November–Early April)

Snow blankets the mountains and the valley, with accumulations of ten feet common in the mountains and two to five feet in the valley.
Day 30° -Night 10° and below

Spring (Late April-June)

Mild days and cold nights are interspersed with rain and occasional snow.
Day 60° - Night 30°

Summer (July and August)

Warm days and cool nights prevail and afternoon thundershowers common.
Day 80° -Night 40°

Fall (September – Early November)

Sunny days and cold nights alternate with rain and snowstorms.
Day 60°-Night 20°
